#### Short course annotation in Lithuanian

Baigę šį kursą studentai gebės išskirti visuomenės etninės struktūros elementus, kritiškai vertinti ir analizuoti jų tarpusavio sąveiką apibūdinant etninių santykių raiškos ypatumus moderniose visuomenėse. ## Prerequisites for entering the course

The course is designed for undergraduate students of the political sciences. It covers main factors, conception, consequences, trends, challenges and theoretical background on international migration as well as programmes of migration management, design of migration policies and migrants' incorporation into receiving society. The course also distinguishes links between migration, human rights, citizenship and Europe's security agenda in the new century.
