Short course description:	To develop communicative language competence which includes linguistic, pragmatic and sociolinguistic components through reception (listening and reading comprehension), production and interaction (speaking and writing) as well as mediation (translation) language skills at intermediate user level (B1.2).
Course content:	The students read, write and talk on the issues of emigration, analyze the topics from the lingua-cultural point of view (Russia-Lithuania), study the themes connected with the expression of individualism, as well as those related to science, work, leisure and other everyday life issues. When presenting their attitude and opinion on the topics discussed, the students employ the structure of an argument (statement-reasoning-assumption-conclusion). During this course, the students develop their knowledge of sentence structure; they are introduced to the grammatical forms of the participle and the adverb and their function in the sentence. The students develop the ability to denote the difference between the adverb and other morphological forms and acquire deeper knowledge of the grammatical forms of numerals.
