Dalykas yra derinamas su magistro baigiamojo darbo rašymu, tad jo užsiėmimai vyksta paskutiniame semestre derinant nuotolinį darbą su auditoriniu. Kurso metu studijuojama politikos reiškinio teorinė refleksija ir praktinės analizės būdai. Kurso pradžioje aptariami pagrindiniai teoriniai metodologiniai politikos analizės principai, normatyvinės, empirinės ir vidurinio lygmens politikos teorijos. Mokomasi taikyti teorinius požiūrius įvairių politikos proceso reiškinių analizei, susiejant su studentų pasirinktomis baigiamųjų darbų temomis. Kurso metu studentai išmoksta pasirinkti jų temai tinkamiausią tyrimo dizainą, empirinio tyrimo metodus bei tinkamai parengti baigiamojo darbo tyrimą bei metodologinę dalį.

Short course annotation in English (up to 500 characters)

The course is combined with the process of master thesis writing. The face to face and distant learning activities take plane during the last study semester. The students study theoretical reflection of political phenomenon and the ways of its practical, empirical analysis. At the beginning of the course the main theoretical methodological principles of political analysis, normative, empirical and middle range political theories are discussed. Students learn how to apply the theoretical views for the analysis of various phenomenon of political process by linking this process to the topics of students' master thesis. During the course students gain necessary skills for the choosing the best research design for their topics, empirical research methods and preparing of research and methodological part of the thesis.

Prerequisites for entering the course

Students should have knowledge of political science which is possible to obtain by completing all the required Contemporary European Politics master programme courses; basic knowledge in Qualitative and Quantitative research methods (BA programme courses)

Course aim

The course aims at generalization and deepening of the knowledge and the research and analysis skills related to the research design of the master thesis, preparation of empirical research and academic writing which were gained during the whole period of studies.
