Re-thinking democracy in Europe through nonviolent resistance: the case of Catalonia

The political struggle in Catalonia has created an unprecedented scenario of civil peaceful resistance for the right to self-determination. The declaration of independence in 2017 and its aftermath have unfolded a mass social movement inspired by non-violent strategies such as the Singing Revolution. The current situation raises the question on the possibility of attaining freedom through nonviolent resistance and opening new horizons towards the concept of Europe of nations.



Aleida Bertran is PhD student in Cultural Anthropology at the Latvian Academy of Culture (Riga, Latvia). Her research focuses on folk festivals and national identity in the Baltic States and North Catalonia. She is also the lecturer of the course *Social Movements and Culture* at her university. Currently, she is the coordinator of the Catalan National Assembly in Latvia (ANC Latvija), a non-political organization that fosters civil engagement with the political situation in Catalonia. The aim of this assembly is to enable debates and conferences while making the Catalan culture accessible abroad.
