Short course annotation in Lithuanian (up to 500 characters)

Šio kurso pagrindinis tikslas – išmokyti magistrantus formuluoti aktualius analitinius klausimus, susijusius su modernaus Lietuvos teatro raida ir taikyti įvairias istoriografines ir meno teorijos perspektyvas teatro istorijos tyrimuose. Kursą sudaro paskaitos, diskusijos ir studentų prezentacijos, kurių metų analizuojamos atvejo studijos, paremtos konkrečia problematika ir tyrimo strategija. Ypatingai svarbi užsiėmimų forma yra seminarai-diskusijos. Studentai mokomi analizuoti istorinius šaltinius ir Lietuvos teatro istoriografiją, formuluoti probleminį požiūrį į Lietuvos teatro raidos kontekstus ir atlikti lyginamąją Lietuvos ir Europos teatrinių praktikų analizę.

Short course annotation in English (up to 500 characters)

The aim of this course is to teach students how to ask important analytical questions concerning the development of modern Lithuanian theatre and how to apply different theoretical tools in researching theatre history. Classes include lectures, discussions and student presentations of case studies exemplifying different research strategies. Special emphasis is put on seminar-discussions. Students will be able to analyze historical sources and historiography of Lithuanian theatre, frame problem viewpoints and contexts of Lithuanian theatre development and to fulfill comparative research of Lithuanian and European theatre practices.

Prerequisites for entering the course

History of Lithuanian theatre

Course aim

The aim of the course is to teach students to pursue a critical approach towards the historiographical discourse of modern Lithuanian theatre, to formulate problematic issues for possible research projects, to apply various methodological perspectives for the historical research of modern Lithuanian theatre practices and to link the processes of modern Lithuanian theatre with the development of theatre in other countries.
