Short course description:	To develop communicative language competence which includes linguistic, pragmatic and sociolinguistic components through reception (listening and reading comprehension), production and interaction (speaking and writing) as well as mediation (translation) language skills at basic user beginner level (A1.1).
Course content:	This course is for students aiming to acquire basic minimal abilities in speaking, reading, writing and listening in Modern Hebrew and to get acquainted with the culture of the State of Israel. The programme is divided into the grammatical aspects of the course (the alphabet, phonetics, orthography), the niqqudot, present tense, combining nouns, verbs and adjectives, pronouns, prepositions, numerals and lexical part, i.e. introduction, acquaintances, family life, food and drinks, home life, climate and learning.
Grading and evaluating student work in class and/or at the final exam:	Colloquium - 20 %, final examination - 30%, class work - 50 %.
