Vytautas Magnus University Student Survey Results On Teaching and Learning

Spring 2021





Survey purpose and scope



At the end of each semester, the University students of bachelor, master, integrated and professional studies provide an opinion on teaching and learning in study courses in an electronic survey.

<u>Teaching</u> was evaluated according to 8 statements in the survey.

The evaluation of <u>learning</u> was focused on the performance of the tasks provided by teachers, the attendance of the study classes and general self-evaluation.

10-point rating scale was used, when 1 meant the lowest evaluation (*extremely poor*), 10 – the highest evaluation (*excellent*). 0 – I do not know / I do not have an opinion / not applicable – was eliminated.

Summary of respondents' comments



POSITIVE COMMENTS

The study content is presented in an interesting, inclusive, informative way with plenty of practical examples and sharing of good practice.

- Teachers provide argued feedback on completed tasks and learning progress.
- Teachers have well adapted the study content to online teaching, learning and assessments.
- The number of cases of sharing recorded lectures is increasing.
- Interesting and relevant study tasks and clear assessment criteria are presented, required literature is indicated.
- Teachers demonstrate a positive attitude and understanding towards students, respect-based communication is dominating.

Summary of respondents' comments



PROPOSALS FOR IMPROVEMENT

Store all recorded lectures in MOODLE environment.

- Do not move away from the essence of the study course and its material and summarized essential information needed for lectures.
- Reduce the workload of distance learning laboratory courses and the volume of additional study material.
- Formulate individual and /or homework and assessment tasks regarding the material already studied.
- Provide more feedback on completed independent tasks and midterm tests to students.

What's next? Use of the survey results



Teachers

- ✓ Discussion of students' suggestions and possibilities to practise them during the first classes;
- ✓ Applicability of students' suggestions in study courses;
- ✓ Sharing good teaching practices;
- ✓ In case of unfavorable evaluation discussing reasons and solutions with study program (field) committee and administration;
- ✓ Review of opportunities for competence development, according to the reasons of teaching evaluation.

Students

- ✓ Ensuring the quality of studying by actively participating in study activities and performing tasks;
- ✓ Involvement in study quality surveys and submission of suggestions.

Administration

- ✓ Organizing the sharing of good teaching examples;
- ✓ In case of unfavorable evaluation

 discussing reasons and
 solutions with study program
 - (field) committee and teachers;
- ✓ Initiation and organization of teachers' competence development.

Study program (field) commitee

- ✓ Initiation and organization of sharing of good teaching examples;
- ✓ In case of unfavorable evaluation discussing reasons and solutions with teachers and administration;
- ✓ Initiation and organization of teachers' competence development;
- ✓ Inclusion of the survey results in the study program improvement plan;
- ✓ Dissemination of the adopted improvement decisions to the students of the study program, teachers and other related persons;
- ✓ Implementation and monitoring of improvement actions.
