The first Forum took place in November 2022 and brought together the presidents of Lithuania, Poland, Ukraine, Latvia, and Romania, along with intellectuals from all across Europe. The Schuman Declaration, the precursor of the European Union, proclaims: "Europe will not be created at once." Drawing on the idea that the creation of Europe is a continuous task, the Forum will become a regular event to ask what Europe is and what its place and role in the world are.

On the occasion of Lithuania joining the European Union 20 years ago, the three main thematic issues for the next Forum will be the enlargement of European Union and associated challenges, migration, and Europe's global competitiveness in the foreseeable future.
