
Aim of the survey and respondents

Distribution of respondents in academic departments















- Evaluate active participation during lectures:
- Ensure the quality, novelty and relevance of lectures;
- Encourage attendance and increase its importance;
- Implement mandatory attendance for at least part of the lectures.

- Emphasize students' duties and responsibilities;
- Create a culture of responsible study;
- Increase students' motivation to learn;

- Organize more scientific events.


Other

Infrastructure and technical equipment

- IT equipment, computers and projectors should be available in all classrooms;
- Sufficient sockets, whiteboards, screens, speakers;
- · New computers for lecturers;
- Adequate temperature in classrooms;
- Access to specialized software (e.g. SPSS, Power BI);
- Higher upload limit for Moodle files;
- Better internet connection;
- Clear instructions on how to use VMU systems.

Workload and salary

- Reduced teaching load;
- Reduced bureaucratic workload;
- Adequate accounting of working time;
- Better work-life balance;
- Higher salary;
- Assignment of teaching assistants;
- Payment for additional activities and consultancy.

- Reducing bureaucracy.







(2023-2024)

Lecturers

- Using more diverse study methods and providing a collaborative environment to increase student engagement;
- Identification of competences to be developed in order to improve the quality of teaching and participation in competency development;
- Communicating with the administration on the need for measures to ensure the quality of studies.

Administration

- Ensuring clear communication with lecturers;
- Improving the planning of study sessions;
- Initiating and organizing the development of lecturers' competences and the sharing of good teaching practices;
- Ensuring the provision of facilities and equipment necessary for study.

Study programme (field of study) committee

- Initiating and organising the development of teachers' competences and the sharing of good teaching practices;
- Developing communication with the teachers of the study programme (field of study);
- Evaluation of the suggestions made by the teachers in the survey and planning of actions for the improvement of study programmes.

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
